- 1** Identify the major Native American groups of eastern North America and give one or more examples of conflict or cooperation between European settlers and major Native American groups. (E) 8.H.1A

- 2** Identify reasons for British, French, Spanish, and Dutch colonization in the New World. 8.H.2A

- 3** Identify or describe the causes and significance of Britain's struggle to keep control of its colonies during the French and Indian War (1754-1763). 8.H.3A

- 4** Identify reasons for resistance and rebellion against British imperial rule by the 13 colonies in North America (1761-1775). 8.H.4A

- 5** Identify or list causes and match the effects of the Revolutionary War (1775-1783). (E) 8.H.5A

- 6** Identify and/or explain the significance of major concepts in the creation of the U.S. Constitution (1787-1788). (E) 8.H.6A

- 7** Identify steps taken during the Washington administration and the First and Second Congresses of the United States to establish a stable and lasting national government. (E) 8.H.7A

- 8** Compare and contrast the views of Thomas Jefferson and Alexander Hamilton that caused the development of political parties in the new nation that affected the nation's future. (E) 8.H.8A

Geography

1 Use maps to identify major changes in physical growth and development of the United States from colonization through Reconstruction (1877). 8.G.1A

2 Identify the major mountain ranges (Appalachian Mountains, Rocky Mountains) and river systems (Mississippi River, Missouri River) of the United States and identify the importance of these physical features in the development of America. (E) 8.G.2A

3 Identify agricultural regions of the United States and how they were used and developed during the growth of the United States. 8.G.3A

4 Identify physical changes in the United States due to human migration, population growth, and economic development. (E) 8.G.4A

5 Use at least one primary and/or secondary source to identify ways people changed the physical environment as the United States developed. 8.G.5A
