

Performing Ensemble: Novice

Creating:
Artists/students use creative thinking and reasoning skills to perceive concepts and ideas to develop works. **CR**

- 1 Compose and improvise simple melodic or rhythmic ideas similar to music studied in rehearsal.** **ENN.1CR**
- 2 Select, develop, and notate or record melodic and rhythmic ideas with characteristics similar to music studied in rehearsal.** **ENN.2CR**
- 3 Evaluate and refine simple compositions and improvisations based on teacher-provided criteria.** **ENN.3CR**
- 4 Analyze multiple performers and multiple instrument techniques needed to create accurate rhythm and pitch, appropriate expressive qualities, good posture, and breath control.** **ENN.4CR**

Performing:
