Elementary Theatre

1. The student develops concepts about self, human relationships, and the environment using elements of drama and conventions of theatre. The student is expected to: **K.1**

- A. develop self-awareness through dramatic play; **K.1.A**
 - B. explore space using expressive movement; **K.1.B**
 - C. imitate sounds; and **K.1.C**
 - D. imitate and recreate objects in dramatic play. **K.1.D**
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2. The student interprets characters using the voice and body expressively and creates dramatizations. The student is expected to: **K.2**

- A. demonstrate safe use of movement and voice; **K.2.A**
 - B. assume roles through imitation and recreation; **K.2.B**
 - C. identify the characteristics of dramatic play; and **K.2.C**
 - D. participate in dramatic play. **K.2.D**
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3. The student applies design, directing, and theatre production concepts and skills. The student is expected to: **K.3**

- A. create playing space using common objects such as tables or chairs; **K.3.A**
 - B. create costumes using simple materials such as cardboard, newspaper, or fabric; **K.3.B**
 - C. rehearse dramatic play; and **K.3.C**
 - D. cooperate with others in dramatic play. **K.3.D**
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4. The student relates theatre to history, society, and culture. The student is expected to: **K.4**

- A. rehearse and perform real and imaginative situations of family cultures of students in the class; and **K.4.A**
 - B. rehearse and perform stories from American history. **K.4.B**
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5. The student responds to and evaluates theatre and theatrical performances. The student is expected to: **K.5**

- A. discuss, practice, and display appropriate audience behavior; and **K.5.A**
- B. respond to dramatic activities through discussion. **K.5.B**
